To enhance focus and effective execution of its mandate, the Uganda Vice Chancellors' Forum has operationalized four Standing Committees. These include:


- 1. Academic and Quality Assurance

Highlights

75th UVCF General Meeting at Africa Renewal University (AfRU).

On 26 May 2025, over 60 Vice Chancellors and university leaders gathered at AfRU, Buloba, for the 75th edition of the UVCF General Meeting. The event featured:

- Inspirational welcome remarks by Dr. Vincent Byamukama (VC, AfRU)
- Keynote insights from leaders including Prof. Jude Lubega on Uganda's PhD shortage and Prof. Barnabas Nawangwe on strategic university leadership




Dr. Vincent Byamukama (VC, AfRU)

Prof. Vincent Byamukama (VC, AfRU) welcomed members as a host and shared the university's history, highlighting its founding in 2007 as the Gaba Bible

Institute, its evolution to university status in 2013, and official launch in 2014. He underscored AfRU's dual mission of academic rigor and character development aimed at transforming leaders for community impact.

Prof. Jude Lubega presented a strategic roadmap aimed at tackling the critical shortage of PhD holders in Ugandan universities. The primary goal is to systematically increase the number of doctoral-level academics in order to strengthen research output, enhance accreditation compliance, and support national development objectives.

Prof. Barnabas Nawangwe introduced *normative* leadership as a framework concerned with how leaders ought to act in accordance with moral and ethical standards. He emphasized that university leaders must go beyond personal interests and align their decisions and behavior with institutional values and societal expectations. He outlined three main leadership stylesautocratic, democratic, and laissez-faire-and discussed how these can be applied situationally, especially in complex university environments.

University Spotlights

African Rural University (ARU) is a pioneering institution in Uganda dedicated to transforming rural communities through women-centered education, leadership, and participatory research.

RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS

Two student-led research articles have been published in the *International Journal of Scientific and Research Publications (IJSRP)* and *ResearchGate*, advancing ARU's Participatory Action Research (PAR) model to a global audience:

RESOURCE MOBILIZATION UPDATES

- Secured a \$20,000 grant for the Digital Hub for Open Research project (1-year implementation); 50% of funds already disbursed.
- Completed a Resource Mobilization & Fundraising Training (Feb 3-7, 2025) in Nairobi, Kenya.
- Strengthened staff capacity in proposal writing and local partnership engagement.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

- Partnered with UNESCO Chair to host Summer Camp 2025 at ARU, featuring participants from Georgia University (Netherlands), Makerere University, Gulu University, and ARU.
- Collaborated with FAWEU, leading to staff training on the Extended Orientation Programme (EOP).

RECOGNITION & AWARDS

On **6th March 2025**, ARU and URDT received the *Women Empowerment Trophy* at the Empower Her Awards 2025, held at Hotel Africana, Kampala. The award celebrates ARU's commitment to empowering women in leadership and education. Vice Chancellor **Dr. Mwalimu Musheshe** received the award on behalf of both institutions.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH IMPACT



Through the Young Africa Works Programme, led by Grace, ARU empowered **2,298 youth** (including persons with disabilities) with vocational and soft-tech skills. Of these, **1,618 were women** and **671 were men**, enabling them to access employment and generate income.



In her own words, "The visionary approach taught me to see beyond obstacles. Through the URDT Continuum, I not only transformed my own life but also uplifted my siblings by paying their tuition. My story is proof that when you transform a girl, you ignite a ripple effect of change in the entire community."


Al in Action


Expanding Programmes and Student Population

These include **Victoria University**, **Metropolitan International University**, **Kabale University**, **Uganda Technology and Management University (UTAMU)**, and **Ndejje University**.
